### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

McQuaid Jesuit offers a rigorous college preparatory curriculum that includes core course requirements and a number of enriching electives. Because of its rigorous curriculum, McQuaid Jesuit holds a permanent exemption from the NY State Regents Exams. Each student must take a full program of studies (7.5 units minimally) each year. With the exception of certain courses, McQuaid Jesuit is on a two-semester system.

### **Campus Ministry**

As a Catholic, Jesuit institution following in the footsteps of St. Ignatius Loyola, Campus Ministry endeavors to be at the heart of every student's McQuaid Jesuit experience. All students are invited to participate in retreats, liturgies, service programs, social justice initiatives, and community events. In order to become "men for others," each student will complete at least 100 hours of service before graduation. The class of 2016 volunteered 23,267 hours to local and international organizations.

- McQuaid Jesuit teachers have an average of 14 years of teaching experience.
- Three Jesuit priests (president, chancellor, tutor) and one scholastic (teacher) are part of the McQuaid community.
- McQuaid Jesuit has more than 40 club offerings including National Honor Society, Masterminds, Mock Trial, Speech & Debate, Executive Council, Biodiversity Club, and Yearbook.

### **Athletics at McQuaid Jesuit**

- 70% of the student body participates in athletics.
- McQuaid Varsity teams captured five Sectional Titles (Cross-Country, Volleyball, Indoor Track, Outdoor Track, Golf) and one State Title (Volleyball) during the 2015-16 year.
